Pastor's Letter

Catholic Ministries Appeal

April 20/21

Dear Parish Family,

In the upcoming weeks, our parishioners will receive an invitation to support the Catholic Ministries Appeal. This yearly appeal is familiar to most of us but this year I would like to invite you to think a little more carefully about why we should support this appeal. As I ask you, I am very cognizant that this is a difficult request, given all our church has been through these past years. Through it all, I remain a supporter of the appeal, and here is why.

When I think of our diocesan church, I mainly think of the people I work with day by day and week by week. I think of the staff in our tribunal office. I am very involved in helping people with marriage in the church, and it is always good to know that I can send people to them and that our parishioners will receive warm, respectful, and helpful assistance.

I think of all the people who work for Catholic Charities in our diocese. They are tireless advocates for our community's poorest members, those who have experienced tragic losses, and especially for our seniors and homebound. Catholic Charities deserves our support.

Our partner share of the Catholic Ministry Appeal helps to support our ministries here. In past years, when we reached our goal, we received almost \$25,000 back to use toward these ministries right here at Sacred Hearts.

I could name more people, but you understand that for me, these people and relationships make my generosity important to the appeal. As Catholics, we should be justly proud of our church's role in the lives of needy Long Islanders and the strength and vibrancy of our ministries. I want to see our parish reach our goal this year of \$65,700. We already have many donors to the appeal and our average gift is \$300. The key is clearly thinking about a pledge to the appeal. Look at how a monthly pledge over the next ten months can make a difference:

- * A pledge of \$100 (\$10/month) can help with heat and light for a needy family.
- * A pledge of \$500 (\$50/month) can provide care and support to a newborn at Regina Residence.
- * A pledge of \$1000 (\$100/month) can support a young man's education toward priesthood.

Your pledge can truly change someone's life. Thank you for prayerfully considering becoming a supporter of the Catholic Ministries Appeal.

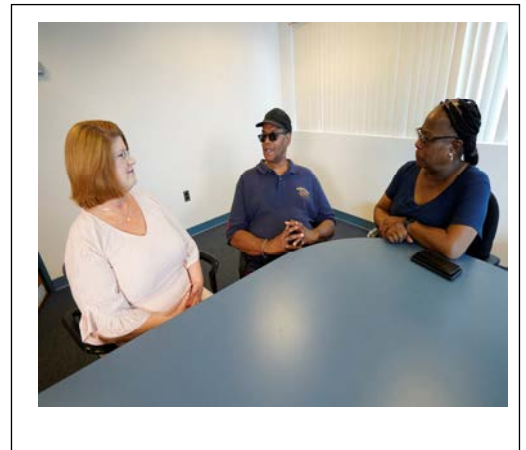

Sisters and brothers in Christ: There is a beautiful hymn based on the biblical passage from **Matthew 25:35-36**. It emphasizes that our actions toward the least fortunate among us are akin to our actions toward God. Here are the lyrics:

Whatsoever you do to the least of my people, that you do unto me.

Verse 1: *When I was hungry, you gave me to eat; When I was thirsty, you gave me to drink. Now enter into the home of my Father.*

Verse 2: *When I was weary, you helped me find rest; when I was anxious, you calmed all my fears. Now enter into the home of my Father.*

Verse 3: *When I was homeless, you opened your door; when I was naked, you gave me your coat. Now enter into the home of my Father.*

Verse 4: *When in prison, you came to my cell; when on a sickbed, you cared for my needs. Now enter into the home of my Father.*

Verse 5: *When I was laughed at, you stood by my side; when I was happy, you shared in my joy. Now enter into the home of my Father.*

This hymn beautifully captures the essence of compassion, kindness, and love for others. It reminds us that our actions matter, especially when directed toward those in need.

Reflection On the Gospel

April 21, 2024

If you feel a bit offended by Sunday's Gospel in which Jesus contrasts a hired hand to a good shepherd, you may also feel a bit justified. Most likely, if we are fortunate, we are hired hands, working for pay. But does that mean we will run when the going gets tough or stick around only to collect our wages? Do we have to own the goods of our trade to be loyal and trustworthy? Is that what Jesus is saying? Or is Jesus simply pointing out how to be a "good shepherd" no matter our work status? He is certainly revealing yet again God's great love for us—all of us, regardless of the "fold" to which we belong. He is also noting the free will God gives us to accept the invitation to be "good shepherds" or not. Similarly, St. John writes of God's love for us, so great that we are called children of God. And St. Peter in the first reading emphasizes our salvation in the name of Jesus. So let us accept the invitation to become "good shepherds" ourselves. Let us extend our love and generosity, our mercy and compassion to all whether within our fold or outside it.

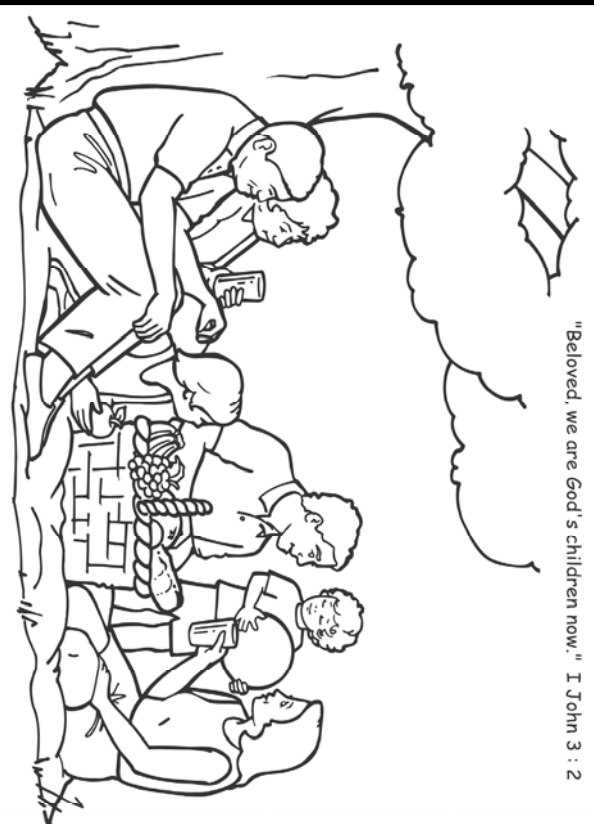

THE LORD IS MY SHEPHERD

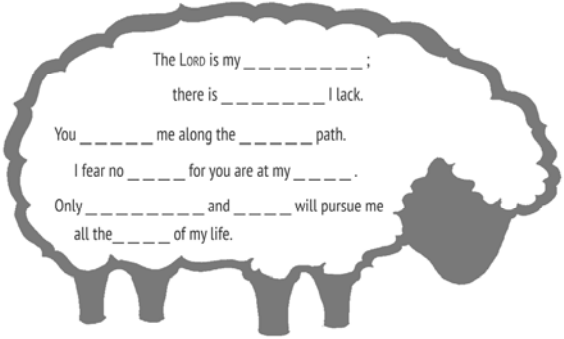
