Pastor's Letter

Vine and Branch

April 27/28

Dear Parish Family,

It has been over fifty years since the last astronaut set foot on the moon in December 1972. I am grateful to have lived through that time in history. I often wonder what those adventurous journeys sound like to young people today. In my youth, these flights were better than those on reality TV. Real-life adventures of danger and accomplishment. They were also spiritual times. Seeing the earth from space and celebrating the achievements of human intelligence and ingenuity was genuinely inspiring. Those who have written histories of these first flights into the vastness of space often describe how their experiences moved the astronauts spiritually.

In 1968, astronauts Bill Anders, Jim Lovell, and Frank Borman were the first to leave Earth's orbit and circle the moon. On Christmas Eve, as they looked back at the beautiful blue-green earth, they took turns reading us the story of creation from the Book of Genesis. They were grateful for the creation they now witnessed in a new way. And then, just a few months later, Neil Armstrong and Buzz Aldrin landed on the moon. Aldrin was a devout member of his church community, and he brought with him a consecrated host and a small vial of consecrated wine from their Sunday Eucharist. Here are Aldrin's own words about this experience:

In a little while, Neil would give the signal to step down the ladder onto the powdery surface of the moon. Now was the moment for communion, so I unstowed the communion elements in their flight packets. I put them and the scripture reading on the little table in front of the guidance computer. Then I called back to Houston.

"Houston, this is Eagle. This is the LM Pilot speaking. I would, like to request a few moments of silence. I would like to invite each person listening in, wherever and whomever he may be, to contemplate for a moment the events of the past few hours and to give thanks in his own individual way."

In the radio blackout I opened the little package which contained bread and wine. I poured the wine into the chalice our church had given me. In the one-sixth gravity of the moon the wine curled slowly and gracefully up the side of the cup. It was interesting to think that the first liquid ever poured on the moon, and the first food eaten there, were communion.

Aldrin's hand written scripture passage

He read the same words we listened to in the gospel this Sunday. *I am the vine, you are the branches, apart from me you can do nothing*. Aldrin had made the connection between his faith and the most amazing of human achievements. I love that our world is more and more filled with wonder. I am thankful that each week we can come together and acknowledge all that we have and all that we do are a gift from God and that without God, we can do nothing.

Knight Light



Knights of Columbus Real of the second state Sisters and brothers in Christ, many years ago, my mother-in-law asked what I wanted for Christmas. I explained that I had seen a passage in a magazine Christmas gift would be to have it hand-written in calligraphy and framed. On Christmas day, there it was, beautifully copied and mounted in a

handsome frame. Today this amazing piece hangs on our wall in our upstairs hallway where I can see it every day. May I share it with you? (Pete Nikolich, Grand Knight, Knights of Columbus, Southampton Council #1967)

"He was born In an obscure village, the child of a peasant woman. He grew up in another obscure village, where he worked in a carpenter shop until he was thirty. Then for three years, he was an itinerant preacher. He never had a family or owned a home. He never set foot inside a big city. He never travelled two hundred miles from the place he was born. He never wrote a book or held an office. He did none of the things that usually accompany greatness. While he was still a young man, the tide of popular opinion turned against him. His friends deserted him. He was turned over to his enemies and went through the mockery of a trial. He was nailed to a cross between two thieves. While he was dying, his executioners gambled for the only piece of property he had-his coat. When he was dead, he was taken down and laid in a borrowed grave.

Nineteen centuries have come and gone and today he is the central figure for much of the human race. All the armies that ever marched and all the navies that ever sailed and all the parliaments that ever sat and all the kings that ever reigned put together have not affected the life of man upon this earth as powerfully as this one solitary life. Reflection On the Gospel April 28, 2024

Children, let us love not in word or speech but in deed and truth.

The words of St. John in Sunday's Second Reading are words we should take quite seriously. It is so much easier to say than to do, and most of us say quite a lot. Just as an example, we may profess our love of nature and our support of conservation measures, but we still waste energy, drive when we could walk or use public transportation, litter and fail to recycle, or condone the use of fossil fuels and oppose renewables because we claim this position is better for the economy despite the fact that it actually harms our health and the survival of our planet. Jesus in Sunday's Gospel uses nature to teach a different lesson: We are all connected and we all have a role to play in bearing fruit for the benefit of the whole community. Occasionally, we will need to be pruned, but that will only enhance our fruitfulness. And what might we need to have pruned? Could it be idle talk or a failure to act? Could it be a failure to love? Indeed, "let us love not in word or speech, but in deed and truth" so that we will bear much fruit as Jesus's disciples.





I AM THE TRUE VINE

say, "I am the good shepherd" (John 10:11). Today he says "I am the true vine" (John 15:1) Jesus uses many images about himself to teach us who he is Think about a shepherd and a vine. What do you think Jesus is saying about himself?

The images and words of Jesus are significant. Throughout scripture, if a word is repeated several times in one passage, it means it is very important. Repetition is like underlining the word or writing it in capitals or in bold print. In today's Gospel, as Jesus talks about the vine, he repeats the word "remain" eight times! "To remain" means "to stay somewhere." Where does Jesus want us to "stay?" "Remain in me," he says over and over. Jesus wants us to stav with him. He will be in us and we will be in him.
